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Village Green Redesign Will Bring New Entertainment and Economic Growth to Wyoming

As social and lifestyle trends continue to evolve toward more walkable communities and inclusive, locally-accessible entertainment, Wyoming is addressing these changes through a new initiative to redesign the Village Green and connect the City's dining and entertainment venues through a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA).

Over roughly the next 18 months, Wyoming will complete upgrades to the Village Green through a phased project that will start with the construction of a permanent performance pavilion announced earlier this year funded by a combination of City Capital Improvement Funds, grant funding, and private donations through the Wyoming Recreation Foundation. The first phase of the pavilion project is expected to cost \$300,000.

The second phase of the project includes the landscaping and sustainability elements, such as a living wall and rain and pollinator gardens, all of which will be available to local students and adults for educational purposes, is expected to cost about \$200,000, with a large amount also coming from private sponsorships.

As the design process winds up, there will be opportunities to further the design, budget, and fundraising efforts to include a third and final phase with:



- New hardscape design features, such as a mini splash fountain
- Park benches situated around the mini splash fountain
- Moveable picnic benches and updated landscaping with more shade trees



During the creation of the 2018 Master Plan, the City was tasked with tackling changing lifestyle trends that meet the needs of today's demographically diverse population. The new Village Green is a major step in addressing these important needs through its ability to host unique programming and by providing a welcoming space for people to gather for fun and recreation. The project also meets core initiatives from the 2018 Master Plan for:

- More diversity and inclusiveness
- Infusing the arts into City programming
- Improving sustainability education
- Addressing health and wellness needs
- Developing and sustaining small businesses
- Building relationships with adjoining communities

The vision for the new Village Green and the DORA will be to provide Wyoming with a connected entertainment district and a premier event space for the enjoyment of local and regional residents. It will offer economic potential for City restaurants and businesses to thrive in the community through increased visibility and a welcoming, inclusive atmosphere.

Fire Hydrant Flushing

Fire hydrant flushing on streets on the east side of Springfield Pike and streets north of Fleming Road (and west of Springfield Pike) will take place on June 3 and June 4. CPR Classes Regularly Offered

As part of its efforts to address the dangers of cardiac events, Wyoming Fire & EMS Department offers regular CPR classes in the spring and fall. The classes use an interactive approach to teach the skills needed to rescue a victim from a sudden cardiac event. If you've never been trained you may not know what to look for and that could waste valuable seconds in getting help.

According to the American Heart Association, CPR performed in the first few minutes of a cardiac arrest can double a person's chances of survival. Each year, roughly 350,000 people suffer a cardiac arrest outside of a hospital setting. Of these, 70 percent occur at home. Only about 46 percent of those who experience a cardiac arrest out of a hospital will get immediate CPR, according to the AHA. CPR classes are \$35 and include certification by the AHA. The remaining 2020 CPR class dates are May 6, September 2, October 6, and November 4. Classes start at 6 p.m. in the training room at the Wyoming Fire Department, 600 Grove Avenue. 
